




## Open Access: SEL ICB Antimicrobial Guidelines via Eolas

Following feedback from clinicians, the South East London (SEL) ICB Antimicrobial Guidelines—hosted on the Eolas platform—are now openly accessible without the need for login or registration. All primary care clinicians across SEL should now refer to these guidelines.

These guidelines replace previously used local versions, including the Lambeth Antibiotic Guideline (2024) and the STI Quick Reference Guideline (2022), which have now been withdrawn. Please update any saved links or references to these older guidelines.
