
This is an Easy Read version of some information. It may not include all of the information but it will tell you about the important parts.

• Who are autistic.

• NHS England (if your child is in hospital).






If your child wants to agree for themselves




Some children under 16 can decide for themselves if they want to be on the DSR.



Even if they can, their parents should take part in the decision unless this is unsafe for the child.



We work out if a child can decide for themself using the **Gillick Competence**.



The **Gillick Competence** is a way of checking if a child under 16 can make their own decisions.

The Gillick Competence checks that a child can:



• Understand the information they are given.



• Think about the choices they have, and what might happen.



 Clearly explain why they are deciding to do something.



• Understand how their decision might affect them now and in the future.



If a child shows they understand enough, they can decide for themselves about being on the DSR.



If they do not understand enough, their parent or carer will need to decide.

Changing your mind



If you decide you do not want your child to be on the DSR, that is okay.



We will help you stop your child being on the DSR and answer any questions you have.
