

## Appendix 1: Community Blood Testing – Guidance for Secondary Care in south east London

Patients are increasingly able to choose **where** and **when** they have their blood tests performed. Many services now use online booking platforms, such as **Swiftqueue**, which offer greater flexibility in terms of location and appointment timing and can significantly improve the efficiency of blood testing services and the overall patient experience. While Swiftqueue advises patients to book blood tests at the same location as their clinic appointment, patients can book appointments across a range of secondary care and community sites depending on where the test was ordered.

However, this flexibility also introduces complexity. The ability for blood test results to flow automatically back to the requesting clinical service depends on **where the test was first ordered, which central system was used, and which phlebotomy service manages and runs the testing process**. Where systems currently do not align, results may not return automatically, requiring manual follow up and creating avoidable delays to clinical decision making and treatment.

The purpose of this document is to provide secondary care clinicians with clear guidance on:

- Where patients should be directed for blood tests (both by online appointment and walk-ins)
- Which locations offer optimal system compatibility
- Where site-specific or service-level limitations apply

This guidance was created in February 2026 and will be subject to review.

## Cross-site Blood Test Access (Epic-based sites)

The below table summarises the blood test options for Epic-based sites. In most cases, blood tests are ordered electronically in EPIC and can be performed at any Synnovis-run phlebotomy location, with appointments booked separately via Synnovis Swiftqueue.

There are two EPIC-based sites with service-level restrictions:

- Guy's Hospital
- The Princess Royal Hospital (PRUH) – including Orpington and Beckenham Beacon

At these locations tests can still be ordered via Epic: however, local service arrangements mean that patients either cannot be bled on-site or are limited to site-specific pathways rather than using Swiftqueue. These exceptions require **explicit clinician guidance to ensure patients attend an appropriate phlebotomy service**. More information on the advised guidance can be found below.

PRUH, Orpington Hospital and Beckenham Beacon operate on a walk-in only system.</p> <p>These sites operate on a walk-in and wait system – patients receive a ticket and are subject to waiting times on the day.</p> <p><b>Note:</b> Synnovis plans to take on outpatient phlebotomy at the PRUH. In Q1-2 26/27 – this will mean that patients will be able to use Swiftqueue to book blood tests at the PRUH rather than solely walk-ins. Orpington Hospital and Beckenham Beacon will continue to run their own services and have a walk-in only system.</p>

## Lewisham and Greenwich Trust Services (LGT)

This table outlines blood test pathways for Lewisham & Greenwich Trust services, which operate outside EPIC (currently) and use separate booking systems. Blood tests ordered within these services should be undertaken at Lewisham & Greenwich phlebotomy locations, using their own Swiftqueue platform. Cross-attendance between EPIC/ Synnovis services and Lewisham & Greenwich Trust Services is not currently supported.
