

What are we aiming to achieve?

A Health and Wellbeing Centre in Bromley Town will help us to:

- Provide fit for purpose buildings for current and future primary care services
- Ensure that there is sufficient capacity for primary care to meet future demand
- Enable the rollout of more health and wellbeing services in the local community
- Support Bromley health and care organisations to deliver services closer to the communities they serve
- Provide a sustainable estates solution for the long term







- In 2017, a property search was undertaken which concluded that there were 12 potentially suitable sites
- 6 of the 12 were discounted as not meeting the required criteria (around location, disability access, access to public transport etc)
- The remaining 6 were appraised and the most credible and financially viable option was the Adventure Kingdom site, located adjacent to the Bromley Civic Centre in the town centre.





Benefits to patients and the local community



Introduction of new health and wellbeing services

Reduced need to attend hospital for outpatient appointments

New staff for patients to see as an alternative to a GP (paramedics, physiotherapists, pharmacists etc) More staff will make it easier and quicker for people to be able to see a health professional

Improved access ensuring the building is fully accessible by those with mobility issues and by central location in Bromley

Excellent car parking facilities in close proximity (Civic Centre car park) Excellent public transport links (16 bus routes stop at the Bromley Civic Centre)

Five minute walk to the Glades Shopping Centre

Improved patient experience by providing a high quality environment



Developing our plans



- Working with the London Borough of Bromley, the vacant Adventure Kingdom building on the Civic Centre site (previously temporarily used as a foodbank) will be refurbished to become the new Health and Wellbeing Centre.
- There will be two floors:
 - Ground floor will accommodate the patient facing spaces for the Dysart GP practice
 - First floor will accommodate the patient facing spaces for the outpatient and wellbeing services
- There will be a small car park for staff, an ambulance drop off and parking for blue badge holders
- The exterior of the building will be improved







How will our plans impact you?

The local community will be able to access more services locally

There will be improved access for patients with mobility issues

The Dysart Practice will remain in its current location until the new building is ready – so there will be no disruption to current services

Co-location of the health centre with the Civic Centre will enable people to access both NHS and council services For residents residing in the neighbouring roads to the site, there will be increased traffic during construction. We will make sure than any impact is minimised

- Planning permission has been submitted
- Planning decision expected February 23
- The Full Business Case (FBC) setting out the commercial arrangements, the final designs and the tendered construction costs will be completed at the end of February 23
- Construction works will go out to tender in January 23 and tender returns will be received in February 23.
- Works will start May 23 and will be complete by March 24.

- We are awaiting the planning decision
- In the meantime, we will continue to develop the design and to produce the tender packages and documentation
- The FBC once submitted at the beginning of March will need to be approved by the NHS South East London Integrated Care Board and then by NHS England
- Once approval of the FBC has been received, we can progress our plans.
