	Equality Impact	There is an emphasis on working with diverse communities across south east London as part of the Anchor work and to particularly engage with communities who experience socioeconomic disadvantage, to build up trust and to ensure local people have access to good work and employment opportunities. As part of the listening exercise we have heard from diverse communities including individuals from refugee and migrant backgrounds, ethnic minorities, disabled, deaf and neurodiverse people, people in low-paid or insecure work, children and young people, carers and lone parents, older people and people from the LGBTQ+ community.				

	Financial Impact	As part of a commitment by the ICP and ICB to address long-standing health inequalities, the Anchor System Programme has been funded for three years (23/24 – 25/26). The Programme is currently running to budget. Where appropriate, the Programme may allow the SEL ICS to access additional funding; for example, a £250k grant has been received from Health Education England (HEE) for Anchor work focused on access to good employment.		
Other Engagement	Public Engagement	The focus of the listening exercise is to listen and facilitate community engagement, identify system-wide actions, and co-design solutions to support the socioeconomic wellbeing of our people and communities.
