

National Screening and Reporting Programmes Privacy Notice

Plain English Explanation

The NHS provides national screening and reporting programmes so that certain diseases can be detected at an early stage. These currently apply to bowel cancer, breast cancer, aortic aneurysms and diabetic retinal screening service as well as other exempt programmes. The law allows us to share your contact information with Public Health England and NHS England so that you can be invited to the relevant screening programme and so that nationally exempted programmes can operate effectively with regards to public and patient health.

4) Lawfulness Conditions and Special Categories	The lawful justifications for the processing and possible sharing of this data are;- <i>Article 6(1)(c) "the processing is necessary for compliance with any legal obligation to which the controller is subject"</i> and <i>Article 9(2)(h) "processing is necessary for the purposes of preventive or occupational medicine, for the assessment of the working capacity of the employee, medical diagnosis, the provision of health or social care or treatment or the management of health or social care systems and services"</i>
5) Recipient or categories of recipients of the shared data	The data will be shared with national and research bodies as allowed by law. Please see links above for full details.
6) Your Individual Rights	Right to Object You have the right under Article 21 of the UK GDPR to object to your personal information being processed. Please contact the ICB
